The Haddonfield Educational Trust, Inc. is a non-profit foundation dedicated to enhancing educational excellence of the Haddonfield Public Schools. The Trust is raising funds through fundraising events, alumni support, community and corporate grants and planned giving. The vision is to create an enduring endowment to support the excellence of Haddonfield Schools in addition to providing annual grants for District priorities consistent with the strategic plan.

#### Over the past year the Trust has:

- Raised \$27,000 towards our goal of \$50,000 for the District's innovative digital learning initiative.
- Partnered with Lights, Camera, Action to raise funds for transforming the High School Auditorium to provide needed modernization for our exceptional Arts program. The project was initiated and spearheaded by Janice Hunt and Deanna Burney who have raised over \$80,000 to date.
- Donated \$20,000 to enable the District to build upon the Drexel University partnership. High School students will have the opportunity to experience an intensive introduction to engineering program.
- Provided \$5,000 in funding for Radnor Field Dugout Project.
- Will provided \$500 in funding for HMHS Wrestling Room, a Class of 1961 project.
- Provided \$500 for the HMHS Hall of Fame.
- Established a collaboration with the Haddonfield Alumni Society.
- Contributed over \$67,000 in scholarship funds to Class of 2011 HMHS college-bound seniors.

# HADDONFIELD SCHOOL DISTRICT NEWS

During this 2011-12 school year, building upon our 125<sup>th</sup> school ranking in the nation by Newsweek magazine, Haddonfield School District has implemented a variety of innovative programs in order to remain an educational leader in the region as we move forward through the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. Some of these programs include; at the high school, a new AP Human Geography course, a Drexel University Introduction to Engineering course, an On-line Finance course, and a Career Internship Senior program. The middle school is also developing an Engineering program in conjunction with Rowan University Engineering School, focusing on the fields of Environmental and Civil Engineering through a possible National Science Foundation grant initiative. In addition, the elementary schools are implementing an engaging, dynamic language arts program that will be integrated into the current language arts District's curriculum, grades k-5, similar to the District's Every Day Math program for its elementary mathematics curriculum.

Along with curricular endeavors and integrating Critical Thinking Skills across the curricula, the School District is implementing new technology initiatives as well. For the first time, all the buildings in the School District will be wireless, beginning in the 2012-13 school year. Much needed technology infrastructure will also be installed including state-of-the-art projection systems for classrooms, additional laptops for use in grades 9-12, I-Pads for the middle school, I-Pads and SMART board technologies for the elementary schools, and additional multimedia systems for classrooms District-wide. The wireless connectivity to all school buildings will enable students and teachers to engage and interact well beyond the walls of the classroom, thus supporting new 21th Century instructional/teaching Digital Learning models. Another District technology initiative includes implementing a new AUP (Acceptable Use Policy) to allow students to bring in their own technology into the school buildings grades 6-12. In addition, the district is focusing on creating a technology collaborative learning project based library at the high school conducive to meeting the needs of the 21st Century Digital Learner.

The District's goal for this school year was "Applying Critical Thinking Skills to Digital Learning." Part of this goal involved providing intense professional development to teachers in the areas of Digital Learning and incorporating innovative technology resources, such as student centered utilization of I-Pad applications, and project based learning across curricula. Professional learning communities also played a key role in teacher collaboration in order to bring instructional best practices into the classrooms. Dedicated fundraising efforts by the Haddonfield Education Trust (HET) and PTA's helped the school district to acquire these technologies for our students. Along with fundraising efforts, the School District recently formed a technology community advisory committee to help establish long-term strategies and goals as they relate to technology initiatives involving curriculum and instruction, infrastructure, and outreach for the District.

#### Haddonfield School District News (Cont'd.)

This past school year, the School District had other accomplishments, including settling the contract for teachers and support staff and adopting a Historic budget for the 2012-13 school year with a 0 percent tax levyl. Due to an increase in state aid, the School District was able to maintain and add to current staffing and programs, improve facilities, upgrade and develop state-of-the-art technology initiatives, obtain and integrate a dynamic language arts curriculum and implement a new teacher / administrator evaluation system.

Within this year's budget, the School District spent close to a million dollars toward facilities with much needed infrastructure repair, including installing a new sound system for the high school auditorium thanks to the efforts of Lights, Camera, Action a community based fundraising organization formed to renovate this auditorium for students who participate in the arts. Some other capital projects included roofing, repairs to heating/HVAC systems and storm drains, and repairs to the Cupola, Soffits, and Fascias at the high school along with structural renovations and improvements to the middle and elementary schools.

The School District's tuition program that welcomes non-Haddonfield students helped the District adopt the 0 percent tax levy. It has also supported the District's reputation as being an educational leader in the region. Ten new tuition students are expected to join our High School this fall. Strong demand at the ninth grade level has necessitated the creation of a waiting list. Interest is growing for the middle school as well, with the anticipation of several new students. Haddonfield's Tuition Program is based on the concept that filling classroom seats will add minimally to costs, while significantly boosting revenue. For the 2011-12 school year, tuition revenue was nearly \$300,000. Tuition students in grades six through 12 are accepted for the general education program only. School principals review records of prospective students to he sure they can succeed in Haddonfield's academic environment.

In regard to the Arts, on Saturday, March 10, the HMHS Drama Club gave its final performance of "The Wiz," a musical adaptation of "The Wizard of Oz." The HMHS Drama Club and Mr. Scott Glading, the Drama Club's advisor, received much praise for these performances. The Drama Club used elaborate costumes and special effect settings to enhance the musical experience of very talented students through their acting and vocalizations.
