2017 Lifetime Achievement Award (LAA) Recipients

Donald C. Burton (HMHS Class of 1956)

Donald C. Burton was born in Lawnside and his family moved to the Sadlertown Community of Haddon Township when he was in 5th grade. He was raised in a very positive, hard working family environment where everyone worked hard to make ends meet and improve themselves. His father set the example by working hard and making sure his children knew "there are no free rides in life". Despite his many chores and family responsibilities, he found time to study hard and achieve on the football field. Don and his younger brother Bob, also known as "shorty", were outstanding running backs for Haddonfield Memorial High School (HMHS) when they were Colonial Conference Champions. After high school, Don volunteered to serve his country; earned his College degree; worked hard in the US Post Office for 7 years; excelled as a policeman for 31 years and retired from the law enforcement field in 1992. In retirement, he established a very successful Bail Bond Business with 3 offices and employing 13 employees; served as a member and leader of numerous law enforcement and civic organizations; and has received numerous awards, several for bravery, and honors. Don has been married twice with four sons from the first marriage and two sons from the second. He set the example for his boys and inspired them to achieve, get a good education and be successful in life. He and his lovely wife, Marcia, enjoy his retirement and travel for a month each year to St. Martin, West Indies, and Key West, FL.

. J. Walter Levering (HMHS Class of 1963)

Walter Levering is recognized for his exemplary achievements in life as a war hero; successful businessman; "giving back" to his schools, church and community; and being a great family man. He was born on June 19, 1945 at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, and his family moved to Haddonfield in 1952. He graduated from Haddonfield Memorial High School (HMHS) in 1963 where he was a varsity wrestler, played football and was Class Vice President. Upon graduation, Walter attended the University of Virginia; however, in early 1966, with the war looming in Vietnam, he volunteered for the Army Warrant Officer Helicopter Flight School and went on active duty in June 1966. On December 21, 1966, Walt took leave and married his "high school sweetheart", Karen Funsten. In June, 1967, he graduated from flight school and immediately received orders to Vietnam. Helicopter pilots were some of our real heroes in Vietnam and did "superhuman things" to save their fellow soldiers at the risk of their own lives. Walt Levering was one of those heroes and, during his first tour in Vietnam, he was awarded the Silver Star and The Distinguished Flying Cross. Walt then volunteered for Officer Candidate School at Ft. Sill, OK, was awarded his 2nd Lieutenant bars and returned for his second tour in Vietnam where he distinguished himself again. During his service, in addition to the Silver Star and the Distinguished Flying Cross, Walt was awarded two Bronze Stars, the Army Commendation medal, the Air Medal with 26 Oak Leaf Clusters and the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry. In June 1971, Walter left the service to spend more time with his family and join the business world. In civilian life, he was well known as a excellent business man, a supporter of community and church activities and a terrific family man. Walt and his family moved back to Haddonfield, later moved to Sherborne, MA and finally settled in Charlottesville, VA where he was very involved with educational activities and his alma mater, the University of Virginia. Humble, brave, ethical, patriotic, positive, adventurous and always smiling describe Walt Levering very well. In the early hours of Tuesday, April 23, 2013, Walt ended his brave and long fought battle with leukemia with his devoted wife Karen, "high school sweetheart", and children at his side. On November 18, 2013, a perfect day for flying, J. Walter Levering was quite fittingly buried at Arlington Cemetery with full military honors.

• Dr. Robert G. Traver (HMHS Class of 1974)

Dr. Robert G. Traver is recognized for his achievements in the fields of engineering and education, his military service, in the United States Army Reserves and in Desert Storm, his leadership and contributions nationally and internationally in water resources management and his contributions to Villanova University in steam hydraulics, urban hydrology, water quality and measures to mitigate storm water effects of urbanization. Upon his graduation from HMHS, Rob followed in his father's footsteps and attended Virginia Military Institute, receiving a B.S. in Civil Engineering. He is a retired Lieutenant Colonial in the U.S. Army Reserves and a veteran of Desert Storm. His advanced education includes a M.S. in Civil Engineering from Villanova University and a PhD from Penn State University. Dr. Traver has been a member of the Water Resources and Environmental Engineering. Program at the Villanova Center and has been the main force in creating a Stormwater Green Infrastructure Demonstration and a Research Park on the campus of Villanova University. In 2016 Villanova University presented Dr. Robert Traver with the prestigious Outstanding Faculty Research Award. This Award is presented in recognition of the central importance of scholarship to Villanova's academic excellence. He lectures abroad, including China. Following Hurricane Katrina, the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) recognized Dr. Traver's leadership of its Task Committee on Flood Safety Policies and Practices and for his work as Editor of the Committee's report, "Flood Risk Management: Call for a National Strategy." Dr. Traver is an associate editor of the ASCE "Journal of Sustainable Water in the Built Environment and serves on Pennsylvania's Department of Environmental Protection's Water Resources Advisory Committee. At a time when our planet has so many environmental and political challenges, it is extremely fitting that the HMHS Lifetime Achievement Award be awarded to Dr. Robert Traver.

Robert A. Peterson, Jr. (HMHS Class of 1968)

Robert Peterson is recognized for his accomplishments as a very successful businessman, a leader in the building industry, an outstanding outdoorsman, a renowned artist and craftsman of creating chainsaw sculptures of animals. a religious leader who has participated in many mission trips to Honduras, a lay minister who mentors people going through tough times and a dedicated family man. At HMHS, Rob set an HMHS record in the mile and, as a senior, captained the cross-country team and co-captained the track team. He graduated from Lafayette College as a math major. After a brief stint at a desk job, Rob wanted more active and varied work that made better use of his outgoing nature so he apprenticed with his uncle who was a successful custom home builder in Louisville, KY. He then established his own very successful homebuilding/remodeling business and later was very active in the Home Builders Association of Louisville and Remodelers Council for 42 years, chairing committees and serving as president. During this time, Rob developed an eye for design and form and was drawn to chainsaw carving. Rob applies the same enthusiasm, integrity, and people skills to his other activities, including: *serving as an elder in his church (Middletown Christian Church); participating for 8 years in the church's week-long mission trips to Honduras to do building proiects at a hospital/children's home; now he is trip leader for the second time; *serving as a Leader for 7 years in the church's Stephen Ministry program (a one-to-one, lay ministry that gives confidential mentoring to people going through tough times); *served on board of trustees for Walden School (a local private K-12 school his daughters attended); as board chair he was on the search committee for a new headmaster. Rob has been married to his wife, Sharon, since 1975. They have two very successful adult daughters, Marie and Julie.

Joyce A Howell (HMHS Class of 1973)

Joyce A. Howell is recognized for being one of the most active and professional volunteers in the Borough of Haddonfield. Joyce graduated from HMHS in 1973 where she distinguished herself as an outstanding field hockey player and excellent student. In her professional life, she has been a highly respected attorney for the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Joyce's career at the EPA has been remarkable for both its depth and breadth and she has been commended on many occasions for her notable achievements in the field of environmental protection. Joyce was a natural leader among the attorneys at EPA, and her program clients looked up to her not only for her excellent legal work, but also as a role model of ethical behavior and hard work. Her enthusiasm for volunteerism on behalf of the town is unmatched. Currently, she is serving as an alternate on the Planning Board and has volunteered for numerous activities for the Shade Tree Commission. For her amazing dedication and quality of her work, she has received numerous accolades and awards throughout her years of environmental practice. She is always willing to share her expertise when community issues arise and has contributed to town efforts on storm water management and sustainability planning. Joyce has always taken great pride in our town, and felt it her duty to contribute to the quality of life for all of us. She has acted on that ethos, and has always been a great role model in her career, her town, and her personal life. Joyce is truly a town treasure and a very worthy recipient of this Haddonfield Alumni Lifetime Achievement Award.

• Melinda K Holman (HMHS Class of 1978)

Melinda (Mindy) Holman is recognized for her extraordinary success as a business person, her terrific leadership and management skills in the automotive industry, her tireless hard work and contributions to charities and her example as a female role model and family member. After graduating from HMHS, Mindy earned a bachelor's degree from the College of William and Mary and master's degree from Old Dominion University. In 1986 she joined Holman Enterprises as a management trainee and subsequently held various managerial positions in the company before becoming Vice Chair in 1994, President in 2002, CEO in 2004, and Chairman in 2015. As the Chairman, she currently oversees 38 automobile dealership franchises that extend from the East Coast to the Pacific Northwest and employ approximately 3,000 people and ARI, the largest privately held vehicle fleet management company in the world, with over 2,100 employees who manage more than 1.4 million fleet vehicles. ARI has been named one of Fortune magazine's "100 Best Companies to Work For" for the past five consecutive years. Because of Mindy's leadership within the automotive industry, she has earned numerous awards and honors to include the Ford Motor Company's Salute to Dealers Award; the Hall of Fame Award from NJBiz; and the National Association of Women Business Owners' "Shattered the Glass Ceiling Award. Mindy personifies the company values that include an unyielding dedication to exceptional customer service and a deep commitment to giving back to the community. In 2011, Mindy led the United Way campaign at Holman Enterprises and raised more than \$1 million, the first milliondollar campaign in the history of Camden County. Many different organizations have recognized her leadership within the community, presenting her with honors like The Girl Scouts of Camden County's Women of Outstanding Achievement Award (1998), The YMCA of Camden County's John C. Gilmour Leadership Award for Community and Organizational Leadership (2000), The Arthritis Foundation of Southern New Jersey's Humanitarian of the Year Award (2003), The Rutgers/LEAP Leadership Award (2006), The American Heart Association's Executi∨e Award of Excellence (2011), The Corporate & Community Leadership Award presented by Bancroft (2014), The Circle of Excellence Award from Samaritan Healthcare & Hospice (2015), and The United Way Tocqueville Award (2016).

John Duffy (Teacher)

John Duffy is recognized for his outstanding performance as a teacher and his unmatched service and commitment to the students of Haddonfield Memorial High School (HMHS). Mr. Duffy served in the Haddonfield Public Schools for thirty-one years from 1982 through 2013. During that time, he was a much beloved and appreciated teacher of World Languages. John's expertise included a mastery of both French and Spanish. Mr. Duffy was a consummate professional who continually honed his craft as a language teacher. He earned his BA and MA degrees from Temple University majoring in Spanish and minoring in French. He made every effort to stay current in language instruction by exploring strategies such as Total Physical Response, earning a certificate of translation from La Salle University, teaching college level world language classes and providing professional development workshops for teachers. Mr. Duffy was awarded a Fulbright Grant to study in Avignon, France, and he participated in the Hands Across the Water teacher exchange in Costa Rica. For students, he organized bilingual exchange programs with ESL students from the Molina School in Camden and he coordinated a summer trip for students to Costa Rica. In addition to all he contributed to the school on these many fronts, he could always be counted on to play in charity basketball games, volleyball fundraisers, or participate in an HMHS Coffee House/Open Mic night. Mr. Duffy was one of those exceptional teachers whose concern for good instruction was coupled with extraordinary empathy and concern for the well-being of students.

- Joseph Ellis was the 2017 winner of the Haddonfield Alumni Society Scholarship. Joseph was a member of the Hugh O'Brian Youth Leadership Foundation and was elected to be a representative from HMHS for the 3 day NJ HOBY seminar.
- He was also a Staff Member and Committee member for HOBY.
- Joe was a student council delegate and a member of the Peer Mentor program for 10th and 11th grade. He completed a Concentration of Studies in Business, and was inducted into the National Honor Society and the French National Honor Society.
- Joe played Varsity Football all four years of high school. In 2013 and 2014 they won the SJ G2 Sectional Championship, and were semi-finalists in 2015.
- Mr. Ellis created posters for National Hispanic Heritage month to raise awareness. Joe was a member of the Winter Track and Spring Track teams. He participated in the Penn Relays, Nationals, and 2016 Sprint Medley State Championship.
- He volunteered for the Food Bank of South Jersey and formed his own organization to head neighborhood food drives. He also organized a spirit week fundraiser.
- Joe was a Haddonfield Japan Exchange Student Ambassador, and a member of the 2014 Drexel University Mock Trial program.
- Joe made first honor roll every quarter of all 4 years of high school.

Dear Alumni,

As we embark upon the 2017-18 school-year, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the Haddonfield Alumni for your continued commitment, volunteerism, mentorships, and support. Everything that you do for our students and community is truly and deeply appreciated. I believe much of our students' successes can be directly attributed to the support of our Alumni and the high standards that have been set along HMHS pathways before them. By way of effectively collaborating and working together, establishing a shared vision for our students, we have been able to provide opportunities for them to reach and achieve their dreams and- because primarily of the efforts of our Alumni- continue the legacy of Haddonfield School District's high-level of Academic Educational Excellence in which we persist to be one of the top school districts in the state, region, and nation.

This school-year will include many new innovative district-wide initiatives and programs that will focus on student-centered instructional strategies, involving Divergent and Critical Thinking Approaches, Technology Instructional Based Innovation, Creativity, and Advanced Problem-Solving Strategies, in addition to STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) programs and student-driven, collaborative activities. Robotics will be one of the new initiatives at all the schools. Diversity, School Climate, and Culture will, in addition, be primary areas of focus, involving professional development for teachers and programs for students.

New courses at the high school include AP Latin, Show Choir (increasing the number of Fine Art electives) and Lab Tech and American Sign Language Student Internship opportunities. There have been, also, revisions to Science (Next Generation Science Standards) and Chemistry Curricular, Mathematics Curricular Updates/Re-alignment, English Curricular Updates, and World Language Updates/Revisions in all levels of Spanish. At the Middle School, Science Courses are

being aligned with the Next Generation Science Standards in terms of integrating Problem-Solving Skills and Authentic Learning Experiences that foster a student-centered instructional approach. The HMS Community will, also, embark on a Middle School Self-Study in which staff and community members will evaluate each area of the Middle School Community in order to ultimately improve programs. At the Elementary Schools, *One Elementary School One Book* will begin in early 2018, the Ambassador Dog Program and Tri-State Response Team will be high-lighted, Robotics Club Grades 1-3, STEM Club Grades 4-5, and other initiatives and programs will be implemented.

School Construction is on its way with much being accomplished over the summer months in terms of repair to all of our school buildings. HMHS B-Wing (Reynolds) Wing has been going through much construction in regard to repairing the B- gym and rebuilding the cafeteria. The District is, also, at this time seeking to fundraise for much needed instructional support for expansion of curricular programs and support of extracurricular programs, involving athletics and the arts. This will include naming the B-gym on the outside of the building once repaired, placing plaques on outdoor tables, classrooms and hallways, and a brick project.

In terms of staff, we have two new dynamic administrators at the middle school and high school. Ms. Tracy Matozzo (formerly the Dean of Students at the high school) has been appointed to the HMS School Principalship and Ms. Tammy McHale, previously Special Education Director from Clearview Regional School District, has become the new Dean of Students at HMHS

In closing, again, I truly appreciate everything that you do to support Haddon-field School District.

Alumni in the News: Damian Mogavero

- Damian Mogavero, class of 89, is an innovator. He has made his mark in the restaurant industry as
 the founder and CEO of Avero. While CFO of a New York-based restaurant group, he witnessed
 the dysfunction at restaurants when chefs and managers did not have the right tools and information
 to run their operations efficiently. Furthermore, Damian recognized that the restaurant industry
 needed easy-to-use software that could help food and beverage operators reach faster, smarter,
 more profitable decisions, while providing outstanding service to their guests.
- Avero Inc., a service that Damian describes as a "web-based business intelligence provider", aggregates over \$24 billion in food and beverage data and has accumulated over 10,000 food and beverage operations worldwide that entrust Avero with their data. Damian's expertise has been widely recognized and written about in publications such as The Wall Street Journal, USA Today, Fast Company, Fortune Small Business, WIRED, Food Arts and Sante. 2017 SPORTS UPDATE

During the 2016-2017 school year our athletic teams compiled a record of 310 wins and 84 losses, leading to winning 11 out of 20 Conference titles, 10 Sectional titles, and 5 New Jersey State Group Championships. HMHS has won 23 State Championships in just the past four years, among the best, if not the best known record of championships than any other high school in the State of New Jersey. For the 39th year in a row, Haddonfield Memorial High School was the recipient of the Colonial Conference All-Sports Award, given to the school with the best conference win-loss record, and for the 14th straight year Haddonfield Memorial High School will be declared winner of the NJSIAA Shop Rite Cup for Group II, an award given to the school with the most sectional and state championships for each of the 6 groups in the entire State. Haddonfield Memorial High School is the only school in the State of New Jersey that has won this prestigious award every year since its inception. Lastly, for the second year in a row, HMHS was the recipient of the 2016-2017 Colonial Conference Sportsmanship Award!


